Evo Morales has won a second term: So what now?

Evo Morales has been re-elected for a second term as Bolivia's President with an unprecedented majority and control of Congress, providing a strong mandate to press ahead with his radical programme of change. Central to this will be the implementation of the new constitution, and Bolivia's international relations. How are political groups on the left and the right responding? What change will the very poor see, and how will international NGOs and Development Agencies be welcomed in future? What are the risks facing the population and the political processes? Our panel of experts will assess the implications and prospects of Morales's second presidency for the Plurinational State over the coming years.
